The Ferrero Tennis Academy is less than 10 minutes drive away and thre are superb links to the Alicante - Madrid motorway and also to the AVE the amazing high speed train link to Madrid that will have you there in just over 2 hours. The pharmacy and supermarket are also four to five minutes walk away and the Cepsa Petrol Station is close by.650€ per month for a minimum contract of 12 months with a payable deposit.
